Session Report

Session met on **March 30th**. Rev. Mike discussed the **Church Leadership Connection Information** form that was shared with the elders. **Heidi Ames** and **Stacie Olney-LaPierre** will find someone to fill the pulpit on November 8th. **Mark Darou** is an **AED** Instructor and he will train church personnel. It was noted that **Wayne Miller** left a **bequest** of \$5,000 to the church.

Books for the All-Church Read were purchased from the SLU Bookstore for \$504.37, which was a savings of \$217.30 if they had been purchased from Amazon.

New people attending church were mentioned. Prayers were given for members and others facing life challenges. Rev. Mike explained how the **pastoral transition** takes place.

The purchase of a large **TV** and equipment for **video conferencing** for the Conference Room was discussed. Money left in the Selleck Fund will be used for this. **Dale Grant** will check with Spectrum about leasing equipment.

The proposed **bylaws** were distributed for review. An April 26th congregational meeting will be held for their approval. Once approved, we can get a **credit card** for the church. It also was noted that we need to appoint a new **Deacon**.

It was voted and approved that **Pat Mace** will continue to serve as the Clerk of Session. **JJ Jockel** is heading up the Strategic Planning Committee for the Session to discuss the pastoral transition process.

Facilities Committee reported that the **door** for the back entrance in the foyer has been repaired but it will need to be replaced.

Next Session meeting is on **April 27th**.

Pentecost Sunday

Prayer Warriors

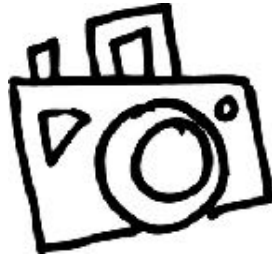

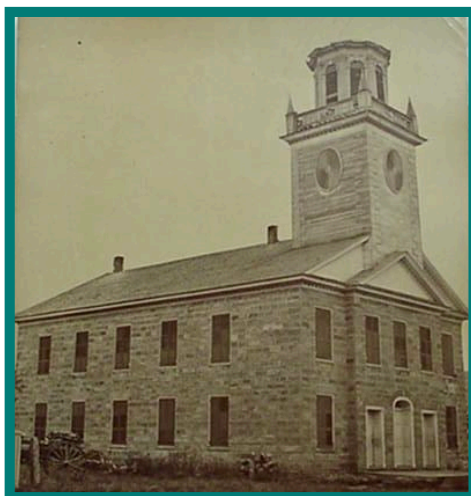
